## Note on your Calendar... Two important Marian feasts are coming up



1-**The Immaculate Conception**, Patroness of the United States, on Wednesday December 8th. This feast day is a Holy Day of obligation. We will hold our usual Holy Day Schedule of Masses.

2-**Our Lady of Guadalupe**, Patroness of the Americas and of our Diocese of Orange, on Sunday Dec 12<sup>th</sup>. Since this is a Sunday, we will hold the normal Sunday Mass schedule. At the 8am Mass, we will have Mariachi music and refreshments afterwards.

**Pope Francis, at the conclusion of Mass on the feast of Christ the King on November 22, 2020, called for a re-launching of the celebration of young people (which was officially called “World Youth Day in the particular churches,” for the Solemnity of Christ the King. ## Laudato Si Action Platform

Along with the entire California Conference of Catholic Bishops, Bishop Kevin W. Vann joins Pope Francis in the launch of the *Laudato Si* Action Platform (LSAP), scheduled to kick off this Sunday, Nov. 14. LSAP is a list of seven goals that the Holy Father has outlined to help spur a worldwide grassroots effort to mobilize Catholics to take action on the environment over a period of seven years. "Every person in the pew needs to understand how important this is and how we can make substantial progress on these issues if we work together, and not instead destroy because of our selfishness," said Bishop Gerald Wilkerson, Auxiliary Bishop Emeritus of the Archdiocese of Los Angeles and chair of the bishops' committee on environmental stewardship.
