FEAST OF FAITH Concluding Rites

The Prayer after Communion gives us a glimpse of the heavenly banquet, of which we have had a foretaste in the Eucharist. The concluding rites speak of what we are to do with this great gift of God. That includes the parish announcements, which are usually given following the Prayer after Communion. Believe it or not, the announcements, which are not an “official” part of the Mass, have been included in the Mass from as early as the fifth century! The deacon or the homilist—even the bishop—would announce coming liturgical celebrations and encourage the people to participate. Today’s parish announcements include opportunities for prayer, service, learning, and community building. They should be succinct and should include only significant events and activities in the life of the parish. But even when they are long and tedious, the announcements (and the parish bulletin) flow out of the concluding rites of the Mass. They offer us ways to live the Eucharist, to become what we have received—the Body of Christ, living and active in our local community.

National Needs Collection

The annual National Needs Collection is being taken up in the Diocese of Orange this weekend. This collection contributes to several campaigns in the United States:

1. The Catholic Campaign for Human Development was mandated by the U.S. bishops to address the root causes of poverty in America through promotion and support of community-controlled, self-help organizations and transformative education.
2. The Catholic Communication Campaign contributes to the process of evangelization by fostering activities in relation to television, radio and other media, and through special projects of the Catholic press.
3. The Catholic University of America collection provides funding for academic scholarships at the only pontifical university in the US in Washington, DC, in response to the commitment made by the bishops at its foundation in 1887. Many of our priests have been trained there.
4. Finally, nearly half of our country is considered home mission territory. Catholic Home Missions appeal helps our Catholic neighbors here in the United States who do not have access to basic pastoral services like Mass, the sacraments, and faith formation.
