Church Synod

Pope Francis has convoked the 16th Ordinary General Assembly of the Synod of Bishops in Rome that will run from October 2021 to October 2023. The theme for the Synod is: “For a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation, and Mission.” The two year Synod will consist of a three phases: diocesan, national, and finally an Assembly of the Synod of Bishops in Rome. The first phase occurs from October 2021 – April 2022 in Dioceses and Bishops’ Conferences, leading up to the Assembly of Bishops in Synod in October 2023”. To kick off the process, a Eucharistic procession, led by our Bishop Kevin Vann, took place at the Diocesan Ministries Celebration on Oct 16th. He will lead a second Eucharistic procession at the end of the 9:45 a.m. Mass at Christ Cathedral this Sunday, October 24. More information will be forthcoming to inform the faithful in our diocese regarding this process of local discernment.

500th Anniversary of the Jesuit Order

Ignatius of Loyola was born Íñigo López de Loyola in the castle at Loyola. At 16 he became a page in the service of a relative. During his time, Íñigo took up dancing, fencing, gambling, and pursuit of the young ladies. Íñigo was drawn by the fame of a military career and joined the army at 17. But 500 years ago, on May 20, in a failed attempt to defend the city of Pamplona, Ignatius’ leg was shattered by a cannonball. Shattered too was what he assumed his life was going to be. During his long convalescence— months of pain and uncertainty, doubt and darkness—he asked for romance novels to pass the time but the only things he found to read in the castle were a Life of Jesus and a book about the Lives of the Saints. These books of meditations initiated a slow process of greater conversion. He began “to see all things new in Christ.” Ignatius became one of the most influential figures in the Roman Catholic Counter-Reformation in the 16th century and founded the Society of Jesus (Jesuits) in Paris in 1534. Over the centuries many believers have made Ignatius of Loyola’s prayer their own: “*Take, Lord, receive all my liberty, my memory, my understanding, my whole will, all that I have and all that I possess. You gave it all to me, Lord; I give it all back to you. Do with it as you will, according to your good pleasure. Give me your love and your grace; for with this I have all that I need.*” The Diocese of Orange has been served well by the Jesuits in many capacities. In particular, Fr. Gordon Moreland served as the director of the House of Prayer for Priests for more than 30 years. Currently three Jesuits serve in the Diocese: Fr. Francis Vu, chaplain at the University of Irvine, Fr. Robert Spitzer who celebrates daily Mass at the Cathedral, and Fr. Allan Deck is a program consultant at the Loyola Institute for Spirituality in Orange.
